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

## HAZARD SUMMARY AND OUTLOOK:

Tropical storm conditions continue for a portion of the region mainly for locations north of I-20 and east of I-65. Conditions begin to improve across the south through the night. Large areas of light to moderate rainfall has spread north and west covering all Central Alabama. Wind gusts up to 50-55 mph will be possible, especially in the higher elevations of east Central Alabama through this evening.
